### Route Description:

Start with a visit to the Black Isle Brewery!

When you're done, head north-east down the road to Munlochy. Pass through Munlochy, and when you meet the A832, go right then immediately left.

The road climbs up toward the top of the Black Isle (Mount Eagle), but before the top of the climb, take a right turn signposted Killen.

Follow the road through Killen to the T-junction at the very end, then turn right and head downhill to meet the A832 again.

Turn left & follow the A832 to Davidston, and the Cromarty Brewery.

Cromarty itself is a bit further along the A832.

#### Remember to:

- Check the weather before you set out.
- Take spare clothing, food and water.
- Take care around other trail users.
- Tell someone where you are going.
- Ride within your limits, and watch your speed.
- Take only photos, leave only tyre tracks.
