START:

Rosemarkie Beach

SUMMARY: A gentle ride along the seafront to (hopefully!) see the dolphins. Take in a walk up Fairy Glen on your return for the waterfalls and bird life (RSPB reserve).

DISTANCE:

2.7km (1.7 miles)

ESTIMATED TIME:

10-20 mins (one way)

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Route Description:

From the Beach Café, follow the path along the beach, over the bridge and join the road. Continue along the road and keep an eye out for a small path branching off on the left. Take this path and follow the coast all the way to the point. Be aware that this path is on the edge of a golf course, so ride with care and respect the golfers. For an alternative route, stick to the road and take a left turn at the T-junction and follow the road that passes down the middle of the golf course. Chanonry Point is one of the best places in Scotland to see dolphins, so keep your eyes out! Return to the café via the same route. For the walk, start on foot at the café, but when it meets the road, turn right. Pick up the path by the side of the burn from the public car park and follow it upstream. There are some narrow sections, but it leads past several very scenic waterfalls, and the glen is an RSPB reserve too. Retrace your steps back to the start,

- Take care around other trail users.
- Tell someone where you are going.
- Ride within your limits, and watch your speed.
- Take only photos, leave only tyre tracks.
